### Enhanced Temporary Additional Early Years Support (ETAEYS)

**ETAEYS** provides funding for children in early years settings, such as nursery, who are experiencing significant barriers to learning.

Practitioners and teachers can refer for a higher level of funding than is already available in that setting. The allocation of ETAEYS funding will mean that for some children, an Education Health and Care Needs Assessment will no longer be necessary or appropriate.

Derbyshire's ETAEYS funding is available for children from the term after they are two until they move into Reception. The funding is available for children who have significant special educational needs and attend either a non maintained or maintained early years setting. Settings will be able to submit documentation directly to show that a child's needs and barriers to learning require additional funding, above the resources normally available to them. If successful, the setting will be able to claim funding from a few weeks after the referral was received by the local authority. By working together on the child's transition plans, the early years setting and the primary school can both get ETAEYS funding to enable a smooth transition for the child.

### My SEND Learning Programme

If children start to fall behind at school then the teachers will give extra help so they can catch up. For some children this isn't enough and they need more specific help in the form of small group or individual work. For these children, schools should record their barriers to learning as well as the interventions and programmes put into place so they can improve their skills and close the gap with their peers. This is known as the 'Assess, Plan, Do, Review' cycle. Derbyshire Local Authority has devised a document which supports this, called the My SEND Learning Programme, although schools may have their own versions. It helps schools and parents keep track of the progress made by the child or young person.

## Meet the Service - SSSSEN

**Who are we?** The Support Service for Special Educational Needs (SSSEN) is a Derbyshire Local Authority Service which aims to ensure the inclusion and achievement of children and young people with special educational needs and build expertise and capacity within schools in Derbyshire. The Head of Service is Belinda James, and made up of 7 teams each with an Area Manager, Senior Teacher(s) and specialist SEN Support Teachers.

**What do we do?** We work with children in maintained nurseries, infant, junior and primary schools with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities (SEND) as part of the provision in their EHC, GRIP or ETAEYS Plan. Support from SSSSEN is agreed when the child has significant barriers to learning and complex learning needs that meet SSSSEN criteria.

### We will:

- Assess your child to find out what help he/she may need
- Work together with you to develop ideas for supporting your child
- Agree targets with you and school staff for your child to work towards
- Work with your child individually, within a small group or in class in mainstream nursery and primary schools
- Provide teaching that is 'additional to or different from' their usual class work
- Keep records of your child's progress
- Write a report for the Review of your child's personalised plan and attend the meeting
- Provide specialist teaching for your child on at least a weekly basis
- Take part in regular planning meetings with you and other staff who work with your child
- Offer advice and training to support school staff in meeting the needs of your child

### A Successful Service:

We strive to maintain high levels of knowledge and expertise throughout the service and many teachers in the service hold further qualifications in SEN. We aim to work in partnership with schools, families and children to provide the best support for the children we work with. Each year we carefully analyse the progress the children we support are making and the children we support have, on average, made outstanding progress for the last three years.

## 4 Derbyshire Locations in June 2017




